Preparing Your Second Semester Routes: Things to Consider

As the end of 2024 approaches, here's a checklist to help your transportation team get their proverbial "ducks in a row" and kick-start January 2025 in full gear.





Route Optimization

- Re-evaluate routes for efficiency based on mid-year enrollment changes.
- !dentify areas for potential stop consolidation, route tiering, and bell schedule alignment to save time and resources.

Driver Scheduling & Coverage

- Confirm driver availability for the new semester, factoring in leave schedules and anticipated absences.
- Update driver rosters and ensure you have a pool of substitute drivers available to manage unexpected call-outs.
- Communicate updated schedules and any changes in shifts/routes well in advance.

Technology & Communication Systems

- Ensure contact information for parents and guardians is up-to-date to improve outreach accuracy.
- Send reminders and key information to parents about route and/or pick-up time changes and safety protocols.
- Plan informational sessions for families or offer a Q&A period to address common questions.
- Preview and update (if needed) notification templates for common situations and disruptions.
- Determine budgets for next fall for technology upgrades/new toolsets.



Review Transportation Policies and Compliance

- Revisit transportation policies for any updates required to align with new regulations or district guideline changes.
- Provide refresher training on compliance topics for all staff.
- Prepare for any upcoming audits or assessments scheduled for the new semester.
- Schedule small group discussions to provide performance feedback and updated guidance to drivers
- Review and adjust eligibility criteria to ensure accurate student assignments.

Fleet Maintenance & Safety Checks

- Perform preventive maintenance on all vehicles, addressing any outstanding repairs.
- Restock safety equipment and emergency supplies in each vehicle; ensure that anything that may have expired (fire extinguishers, etc.) is replaced.

Winter Weather Preparations (if applicable in your area)

- Review and update winter weather protocols, including communication channels for delays and closures.
- Ensure all buses are equipped with winter kits (chains, salt, shovels).
- Train drivers on safe driving practices in adverse conditions.
- Remind drivers to eliminate idling on school grounds when possible to reduce the amount of exhaust on campus and to increase fuel efficiency.

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
